From the past into the future our Autumn Term learning journey will take us into a world of imagination, invention, innovation and space exploration.

English

Using the story of The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe, we will create our own story and write non-chronological reports about mythical beasts. We'll move on to explore the worlds of science fiction and use structured poetry to express our ideas about the universe and beyond.

Maths

As mathematicians this term, we will work on place value in 6-digit numbers, addition and subtraction using larger numbers, multiples, factors and prime numbers, followed by fractions.

Science

As scientists, we will explore forces and their effects. We will go on to study our solar system and our place in space. We will then learn about the effects of global warming on our planet.

RE

Our first theological enquiry will be "Why is the Bible so important to Christians?" We'll then go on to investigate Matthew and Luke's versions of the nativity story as we wonder "What does the Bible tell us about the real meaning of Christmas?"

History

As Historians we will be exploring the legacy of the Early Islamic Civilisation- a Golden Age of ideas and invention.

Geography

We'll ask the question "Is there enough for everyone?", look at how climate and factors affect the world's food production, and consider the impact of food waste and our carbon footprint.

Art and Design

As artists we will follow a drawing pathway, exploring typography and mapmaking.

Design and Technology

This terms DT will be a food project to create a low-carbon footprint seasonal soup with some freshly baked bread of our own design.

Music

Mr. Boardman will be teaching us to play the trumpet. At the end of the term, you will be invited to our first concert, when we will share our progress and practice our performance skills.

PE

In gymnastics, we will explore balancing skills. We'll create our own games and then dances around the theme of space exploration, as well as practising skills for indoor athletics.

Computing

To help us understand how to search the internet safely, our first unit of work will be Computing Systems and Searching. We'll move on to create media in the form of vector drawings.

Languages

Monsieur Hope will be teaching French on Mondays. We'll expand our vocabulary around the face, food, the supermarket, directions, clothes and sports.

PSHE

As the first primary school in Garstang to take on the challenge of Police Mini-Cadet Training, we will learn how the police serve us and what we can do to serve others in the community.
