Spring Term Learning

Below is an overview of the curriculum that will be covered in the spring term.

English

Children will continue to learn the Set 3 sounds whilst recapping Set 1 and 2. We will enjoy a range of stories which we will base our writing on. Children will be taught to punctuate their sentences using a capital letter and full stop. They will also be taught to join words and clauses using and. Children will continue to work on their letter formation.

This term, children will complete units on place value (within 20), addition and subtraction (within 20), place value (within 50), length, height, mass and volume.

We will learn about five of the groups used to classify animals: mammals, fish, birds, reptiles and amphibians. In the second half term, we will learn about plants and caring for the planet.

Our RE units this term are 'Jesus' and 'Easter'. We will explore Bible stories which reveal Jesus' power and miracles. In the second half term, children will hear and retell the Easter Story.

We will learn about the key events of the Great Fire of London using historical sources. We will compare life in the 17th century to the present day and explore why the fire spread so quickly.

Geography

We will investigate the UK by locating the four countries and capital cities on a map. Children will investigate UK weather, capital cities, towns, countryside and the seaside.

Art and Design

Children will be introduced to watercolour. Through an exploratory approach, children will be encouraged to discover how watercolour can help reveal the "story" of a painting.

Design and Technology

In the second half term, children will design and make free-standing structures. They will join sheet materials and reclaimed boxes together to make their own playground equipment.

Music

We will listen and sing along to songs. Children will find and keep the pulse or beat by marching, clapping or swaying in time to music. They will play glockenspiels alongside songs.

P.E. sessions are scheduled to take place on a Tuesday and a Thursday each week. This term, children will undertake units on underarm throwing and dance.

Computing

Children will complete units on 'Programming' and 'Digital Writing'. They will be introduced to early programming concepts and identify what each floor robot command does and use that to predict the outcome of programs. In the second half term, children will use a computer to create and change text.

Languages

In the infants, children learn Spanish. This term, we will learn how to say the numbers to 10, names of fruits and how to say The Hungry Caterpillar Animals.

PSHE

We will cover age-related topics over the year. This term we will be concentrating on 'Keeping Safe' and 'Rights and Respect'.
