English

In English, we will be reading and responding to our texts: 1000 Year Old Boy by Ross Welford and later, the American classic, Holes by Louis Sachar. We will continue to develop our reading strategies for comprehension and experiment with a variety of writing structures linked to the novels, including writing in role, developing our own story settings and plots together with writing persuasive advertisements and non-chronological reports.

Maths

In maths, we will start by learning how to convert units of measurement before learning about fractions, decimals and percentages and their equivalence. Later, we will focus on ratio, algebra, perimeter, area and volume and statistics, in addition to securing fluency and arithmetic skills.

Science

To begin, our science focus is light. We will be learning about how light travels, how we see and how shadows are formed before learning about light pollution. Later in the term, we will learn about the circulatory system, the importance of diet and exercise as well as scientists who are famous for their contributions to health.

RE

In RE, we will be finding out about why Christians celebrate the Eucharist, learning about the Exodus and later, of course, Easter.

Geography

In geography, we'll be using maps and globes to locate world countries and learn about the significance of latitude and longitude and their links with climate and time zones. We will focus in on the Americas, learning about physical and human geography before planning a trip: 'Race across the Americas.'

Art and Design

We will learn about artists who explore their identity within their art before creating our own layered self-portraits

Design and Technology

To link with science, we will be planning a healthy, hot balanced meal.

Music

Mrs Gaughan will be teaching music on Monday afternoons. We'll be listening and responding to a variety of musical genre, as well as using the ukulele and glockenspiels to compose and perform pieces.

PE Turn

On Tuesdays, our PE focus is gymnastics. On Thursdays, we will be outdoors practising invasion games skills with Andy, a coach from Fleetwood Town.

Computing

In computing, we'll be learning how to programme and how to organise and use data by creating spreadsheets.

Languages

Monsieur Hope will be teaching French. We'll be learning how to describe a typical day, our likes and dislikes as well as describing the weather and changing seasons.

PSHE

In PSHE, we will be learning how to keep ourselves safe, including e-safety, and later, about rights and respect.
